### **HUMA 1302**

### Introduction to Humanities II - Non-Western

CRT HRS:3 LEC HRS:3 LAB HRS:0 OTH HRS:0

This stand-alone course is an interdisciplinary survey of cultures focusing on the philosophical and aesthetic factors in human values with an emphasis on the historical development of the individual and society and the need to create. The emphasis of this course will be on the historical development and interplay of the arts, literature, philosophy, and religion in selected non-western cultures.

Prerequisite: HUMA 1301.

### **Education**

Replace "Life & Physical Sciences Electives – Field of Study" with SPAN 2313 – Spanish for Native/Heritage Speakers I and MUSI 1306 – Music Appreciation in the EC- 6 Generalist Associate of Arts in Teaching.

**Justification:** The proposed change to remove "Life & Physical Sciences Electives – Field of Study" from the Field of Study and replace with SPAN 2313 – Spanish for Native/Heritage Speakers I and MUSI 1306 – Music Appreciation will align with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board Field of Study for the EC-6 program.

2. Requirement of MATH 1414 – College Algebra for the Mathematics Elective - Core Curriculum for the EC-6 Generalist Associate of Arts in Teaching.

**Justification:** The proposed change will align with the THECB field of study.

3. Requirement of ARTS 1301 – Art Appreciation for the Creative Arts Elective - Core Curriculum for the EC-6 Generalist Associate of Arts in Teaching.

**Justification:** The proposed change will align with THECB field of study.

4. Removal of COSC 1301 – Introduction to Computing as a recommended option for the Component Area Option – Core Curriculum for the EC-6 Generalist Associate of Arts in Teaching.

**Justification:** The proposed change is needed because COSC 1301-Introduction to Computing is not required and the speech course benefits students in preparation for transfer to the university.

5. Revise the Language, Philosophy & Culture Core Curriculum Elective courses with SPAN 2315 - Spanish for Native/Heritage Speakers II.

Dr. Juan Ramirez

Justification: The proposed change will align with UTRGV's transfer plan and prepare the student for the Spanish content exam.

- 6. Removal of "Recommended PHYS 1415 Physical Science I" for the Life & Physical Sciences Elective and allow an open option for students.
- 7. Removal of "Recommended PHYS 1417 Physical Sciences II" for the Life & Physical Sciences Elective and allow an open option for students.

Justification: UTRGV does not require a specific science sequence. This will allow students to choose options that may be needed for directive electives if transferring to an institution other than UTRGV.
