Justification: The proposed revision of the course subject, title, and description encompasses the preparation for a healthcare career in addition to healthcare education.

Current:

CSFH 0101 College Success for Healthcare

This course aids the healthcare student to perform successfully in healthcare education by understanding his or her personal learning style, understanding and using college policies and procedures including clinical requirements, criminal background authorizations, vaccinations, drug and alcohol testing, managing time, memorizing information, reading textbooks for maximum learning, taking effective notes from lectures and books, maximizing test scores, thinking critically, communicating well both orally and in writing, by learning and applying library and technological healthcare research techniques, and by learning about each of the healthcare professions taught at South Texas College. Some healthcare programs award points toward selection for completion of CSFH with a grade of "A" or "B". This course fulfills a requirement for all first-time developmental students who are not TSI complete, and for all students (including transfer students) with grade point averages below 2.0. It is not required for students who are TSI exempt.

Prerequisite: None.

Proposed:

HSCC 0101 Healthcare Career Development

This course aids the prospective healthcare student to perform successfully in healthcare education and career by exhibiting professional behavior and appearance, understanding the clinical requirements for healthcare education and jobs, applying ethics to educational and healthcare situations, acquiring resources and tools for mastering healthcare knowledge and skills; communicating and working well in a group as well as one-to-one, documenting properly in a healthcare setting and writing according to defined procedures and rubrics; using critical thinking skills in the classroom and the healthcare setting, and introducing the student to the various healthcare programs available at South Texas College. Some healthcare programs award points toward selection for completion of CSFH with a grade of "A" or "B". This course fulfills a requirement for all first-time development students who are not TSI complete, and for all students (including transfer students) with grade point averages below 2.0 it is not required for students who are TSI exempt.

Justification: The proposed revision will fulfill the General Education requirement.

2. Replace “ARTS 1301 – Art Appreciation” with “Humanities Elective.”

Justification: The proposed revision will allow a greater level of career and transfer of learning relevance while providing a good curriculum balance.

3. Replace “PSYC 2301 – General Psychology” with “Social and Behavioral Sciences Elective.”

Justification: The proposed revision will allow for greater academic flexibility and relevance, improved alignment with legal studies, and enhanced transferability.

4. Requirement of MATH 1332 – Contemporary Mathematics for the Mathematics/Natural Sciences Elective Option.

Justification: The proposed revision ensures that students complete a mathematics course that is highly applicable to legal studies relevant to the profession.

5. Addition of BCIS 1305 – Business Computer Applications for the Paralegal Associate of Applied Science.

Justification: The proposed revision will improve alignment with industry standards and follow ABA – American Bar Association requirement. This course completes the 15 SCH general education requirement and provides a course for students to increase technical skills related to software applications.

6. Addition of 25% or more of course credits in degree and decrease of time to completion by more than one term to the Paralegal Associate of Applied Science.

Justification: The proposed revision significantly updates the degree structure to better reflect current industry expectations, modern legal-office competencies, and statewide curriculum standards.

7. Approval for proposed Legal Assistant Certificate.

Justification: The proposed certificate will provide students with a defined and accessible career pathway into the legal profession while meeting workforce needs in a high-demand occupation.
