## Agenda Item

• Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Jesus Amaya at 4:00 p.m.

• Housekeeping Rules

Jesus Amaya discussed the housekeeping rules as follows:

- Minutes from Meeting of December 5, 2024

Jesus Amaya requested the committee members to review the minutes from the previous meeting, which were emailed for revisions or corrections. The motion to approve was made by Fred Cady and was seconded by Dr. JeanMarie Fors. The majority of the committee voted in favor of the motion: 23 in favor / 0 opposed / 0 abstained. The motion carried.

### New Business

#### Criminal Justice

- 1. Approval of course options for the Investigations Concentration in the Criminal Justice Associate of Arts
- 2. Approval of course options for the Criminal Law Concentration in the Criminal Justice Associate of Arts.

James Blair presented on items 1 & 2 stating that they are creating career-focused concentrations within the Criminal Justice Associate of Arts degree plan. These options will allow students who are not transferring to a four-year institution to choose a concentration based on their professional goals without needing the program chair's involvement.

Several concerns arose from the committee as follows:

- The title of the concentrations and how they overlap with other programs/tracks outside their division which may cause more confusion to students.
- Whether student success would be measured based on employment or transferring to a university for students going through a concentration.

- Performance-based funding, and if the college will be funded based on students who gain employment right after graduation.
- Whether concentrations are necessary if the course can be taken within the elective course options. Adding whether some of the repeated courses from the concentrations to be part of the field of study, making it a requirement for all students pursuing the Criminal Justice Associate of Arts. It was also mentioned that some of the courses have the same learning outcomes regardless of concentration.

Vanessa Salinas weighed in to provide examples of advising issues where students were unaware of their course options, adding that these concentrations would help clarify the issue.

After extensive discussion, the committee agreed to table the item until the presenter could provide additional information. Dr. Paul Gonzalez motion to table item 1 and was seconded by Veronica Rodriguez. The majority of the committee voted in favor of the motion: 23 in favor / 1 opposed / 3 abstained. The motion carried.

Dr. Wendi J. W. Williams moved to table item 2 and was seconded by Dr. Paul Gonzalez. The majority of the committee voted in favor of the motion: 24 in favor / 0 opposed / 1 abstained. The motion carried.

There being no further business, the motion to adjourn was made by Dr. Micah Bailey and was seconded by Melinda Tellez. Jesus Amaya adjourned the meeting at 4:45 p.m. The majority of the committee voted in favor of the motion: 27 in favor / 0 opposed / 0 abstained. The motion carried.

# Addendum to Minutes for College-Wide Curriculum Committee Meeting -April 24, 2025

# Kinesiology

1. Revision of course description for KINE 1164 – Introduction to Physical Fitness and Wellness.

The Office of Curriculum, Planning & Compliance received a revision request from the Kinesiology department. This item was scheduled for the April 15, 2025, CWCC meeting; however, since it was the only item on the agenda, the item was elected to be processed as an email vote on April 14, 2025.

The Kinesiology department requested the following revision that required a majority vote of the College-Wide Curriculum Committee:

Course description update for KINE 1164 – Introduction to Physical Fitness and Wellness. This course is listed in the Component Area Option of the Core Curriculum. The Kinesiology department requested to update the course description in order to align with the ACGM published description.

The final results of the vote for the proposed revision were compiled on April 24, 2025 as followed:

- 29 Voted "Yes"
- 0 Voted "No"
- 0 Voted "Abstain"
- 2 did not respond with a voting preference

The majority vote from the committee was in favor of the item. The motion carried.

The Office of Curriculum, Planning & Compliance moved forward with applying the update to the 2025-2026 catalog.
