A COMMITMENT TO EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AND LEARNING

Biology Faculty Bring Nationwide Phage Hunters Research Program to STC

Faculty at South Texas College have made it possible for our students to participate in SEA-PHAGES (Science Education Alliance-Phage Hunters Advancing Genomics and Evolutionary Science), a two-semester, discovery-based undergraduate research course. Through this program, South Texas College offers immediate immersion in authentic, valuable, accessible undergraduate research opportunities designed to foster scientific inquiry and discovery. South Texas College students participating in the SEA-PHAGES program are Dual Enrollment Medical Science Academy (DEMSA) juniors from nine of our partnering high schools. Biology faculty involved with securing and implementing this program include Dr. Thomas Ndolo, Dr. Mehrzad Mahmoudian-Geller, Dr. Shima Chaudhary, and Mr. Jorge Cantu.

South Texas College was the only higher education institution in the Rio Grande Valley to gain admission to this prestigious program. Established by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute and comprising a nationwide collaboration of 177 institutions, the program enlists students to help discover new bacteriophage species. On January 21, 2020, South Texas College received exciting news that one of the samples, submitted a DEMSA student, isolated a new Microbacterium Actinobacteriophage. The dual enrollment student that submitted the sample was able to name the new phage *DelaGarza* in honor of her father.



Faculty Play Vital role in Reaffirmation and Pass Rates of NAH Programs

Excellence in teaching and learning is exemplified division-wide with the successful reaffirmation of all program accreditations within the Nursing and Allied Health Division. Focused on educational goals and objectives and effective strategies for achieving them, NAH faculty ensure success in program outcome measurements. This was evidenced in May 2020 with hundred percent pass rates in national licensure among students in six different NAH programs. Healthcare professionals consistently remark on the quality of knowledge and skills our NAH students exhibit in clinical environments, which is a testament to the quality of instruction provided within he faculty.





A COMMITMENT TO STUDENT SUCCESS

Faculty Distribute Symbolic Degree Covers to Celebrate Student Success

South Texas College faculty symbolically distributed degree covers, regalia, and yard signs to graduating students, beginning with the Bachelor's Program on June 1, 2020. In the days that followed, faculty throughout the College continued to don their own academic regalia to honor graduates with concurrently scheduled distributions at the Pecan, Mid-Valley, and Starr County Campuses. Degree covers were distributed curbside to graduating students who were asked via email invitation to pick up their "degrees" at scheduled times.

Commencement is a milestone event for students and their families. Due to COVID-19, the Spring 2020 commencement ceremonies were cancelled. Faculty, program chairs, and deans demonstrated extraordinary efforts to honor and commemorate our graduates in memorable ways including creating virtual celebration videos and preparing recorded video messages.

Faculty Commit to Open Educational Resources

Reducing the financial burden of a higher education for our students is a major focus, and a component of that is increasing the use of Open Educational Resources (OER). Our bachelor programs were one of the first instructional areas to convert 100% to OER. Some of the other programs committed to OER are Computer Information Systems, Computer Science, Mathematics, and Sociology. In Spring 2020, an inventory of programs using OER was conducted as well as the process of identifying programs that would commit to being OER-based. Dr. Rolando Longoria was quick to offer his assistance with this initiative.



"This year marks the second year that all faculty have been using the OER version of our Intro to Sociology Book, "Intro to Sociology 2e" with Openstax. The move towards OER textbooks was initiated when SOCI was still part of the CRIJ department. Since then, we've had some good feedback from students, school districts, and instructors. We are working up resources that can be shared by all SOCI instructors in the department, and DC instructors as well. These are saved on a BlackBoard shell that all faculty have been added to; from this shell they can copy and transfer resources into their classes easily."

Inaugural Chair Academy Starts in Fall 2019

On September 6, 2019, the South Texas College Chair Academy began with an inaugural cohort of 19 chairs from across the academic divisions. Dr. Anahid Petrosian welcomed attendees and stated that developing the Chair Academy was one of her long-term goals; she expressed gratitude that after many years her vision became a reality. The mission of this Academy is to provide program chairs with the tools they need to be successful leaders and engage in effective college service. The Academy consists of six sessions and a certificate ceremony. Participants complete pre-session assignments that incorporate the following Academy curriculum topics:

- Role of the Chair and Hiring Procedures for Faculty and Staff
- Resolving Conflict
- Scheduling and Course Assignments
- Program Management and Development Process
- Developing Comprehensive and IE Plans
- Budget and Purchasing

South Texas College Faculty Transition to Online Instruction

On March 13, 2020, the South Texas College community was notified that regularly scheduled, on-campus, face-to-face classes would be suspended the week after Spring Break and would resume on Monday, March 30, in an online format due to the coronavirus outbreak. During this one-week timeframe, STC faculty and staff transitioned 4,000 courses to an online modality.



With dedication and determination, STC faculty participated in accelerated training sessions such as "Suddenly Online" and "Using Zoom to Connect with Your Students." These online workshops offered faculty training on how to video conference, screen share, and use the virtual whiteboard to teach students. Faculty also learned how to create Zoom sessions in Blackboard and record live sessions that can be linked to Blackboard for those students who were unable to participate in live sessions.

A total of close to 1,000 part-time and full-time faculty have completed Online Teaching Certification.

STC Food Pantry services are college-wide with locations on the Pecan, Mid-Valley, and Starr County Campuses, providing support for students who are experiencing food insecurity with nutritious food items. "There has been a lot of preparation and a lot time that has gone into this but it has been a true team effort," said Culinary Arts student, Roxanne Aguilar. "I am glad I could be here to help students."


