**Notes/Comments:**

- (1) CJSA 1322 or CRIJ 1301 (CRIJ 2361). CRIJ 1301 (CRIJ 2361) is required for the B.A.A.S. degree with a Criminal Justice concentration. If CJSA 1322 is selected, then the student will still need to take CRIJ 1301/2361.
- (2) 36 hours of work-force class will transfer in-block. See SHSU B.A.A.S. Program Coordinator for more details.
- (3) CJSA 1359 or CRIJ 2328 (CRIJ 2364). CRIJ 2328 (CRIJ 2364) is required for the B.A.A.S. degree with a Criminal Justice concentration. If CJSA 1359 is selected, then the student will still need to take CRIJ 2328/2364.
- (4) MATH 1332 or MATH 1342 is recommended. Select any course from the Core Curriculum II: Mathematics section.
- (5) SPCH from Core Curriculum IX: Component Area Option is recommended.
- (6) Law Enforcement Elective – Choose one (1) of the following:
  - CJLE 1325 – Criminal Justice Survey
  - HMSY 1337 – Intro to Homeland Security
  - CJLE 1374 – Stress Management for Law Enforcement Officers
  - CJLE 1303 – Basic Telecommunication Certification
  - CJCR 1300 – Basic Jail Course
- (7) Advanced CRIJ Electives - 3000 - 4000 level CRIJ courses

- (9) The total hours reflect the inclusion of two lower-division courses -- CRIJ 2362 and CRIJ 2364 -- in the Criminal Justice Concentration. If the student does not have prior credit for CRIJ 2362 and CRIJ 2364, the total hours increase to 126.

#### ***Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences: Criminal Justice Concentration***

- Student must earn a 2.0 minimum overall GPA in all coursework.
- 36 semester hours of advanced coursework (3000 or 4000 level) are the absolute minimum. Minimum number of semester hours in residence: 30 semester hours of which 24 must be advanced.
